Subject: Gazette Notice DGRB-010-07 – Consultation on Proposed Conditions of Licence to Mandate Roaming and Antenna Tower and Site Sharing and to Prohibit Exclusive Site Arrangements (the Consultation)

Bell Mobility requests, for the reasons addressed below, that the department include a reply comment round in the process established for the above captioned Consultation.

In this regard, the Consultation is addressing matters which are of considerable business, technical and operational complexity and the resulting decisions will impact on many aspects of Bell Mobility's operations. In addition, the decisions made following the Consultation will permanently affect the Canadian wireless industry as the Policy will entail significant costs on the part of both existing and future licensees to implement. It is therefore important that the process to address the complex issues being considered in the Consultation be designed to test the soundness, suitability and practicality of the initial comments of parties.

Hence, a reply comment round, a normal feature in industry consultations and public notices of this nature, will facilitate the department's appreciation and understanding of the issues. This would be in the best interest of all concerned parties.

Regarding timing, Bell Mobility submits that a two week reply period would be both warranted and very reasonable given the subject matter at hand and not delay the timing of the upcoming auction. Accordingly, replies would be due by no later than February 5, 2008.
